# Just transition measurement approaches: A summary fiche

#### Aim and scope

The 'Just transition measurement approaches' catalogue provides local and regional policymakers and practitioners with an overview of methods and frameworks to evaluate the impact of just transition processes.

### **Approaches to measurement**

The <u>catalogue</u> aims to inspire Just Transition Fund (JTF) regions on how they can monitor and evaluate the results and impact of their transition process and implementation by offering some good practice approaches from JTF regions and around the world, including:

- The Common Output and Common Result indicators of the Just Transition Fund Regulation, which reflect the implementation of Territorial Just Transition Plans
- The Transition Performance Index which looks at economic, social, environmental and governance dimensions
- A range of social justice indicators which cover poverty, income and inequality, together with access to services
- The Keys for Sustainable and Just Cities tool which looks at political power, accessibility, finance and participation.



## **Good practice in approaching just transition measurement**

The catalogue introduces a number of best practices, including:

- Using indicators specific to the context of the region
- Ensuring indicators and monitoring models are flexible and can be adapted as circumstances evolve
- Setting up a monitoring body to oversee the implementation of measurement systems, with a focus on transparency and inclusion
- Keeping in mind that evaluating the social dimensions of the transition may require qualitative evaluation
